The Tobacco Farm Life Museum is a non-profit 501c3 organization that started in 1983 with on-farm tours to local farms. It has grown to include a 6,000 square foot gallery, a workshop, pack house, traditional homestead, tobacco barn and one room school house. The Museum's mission is to preserve and present the heritage and history of the rural North Carolina farm family between 1880 and 1940. We fulfill this mission through exhibits and events that focus on the farm community.
